The Mediation Center of Greater Green Bay has provided dispute resolution services with trained volunteers since 1998. They mediate a variety of issues including small claims, eviction, and family issues involving minor children. This seminar will encourage and train participants to become volunteer mediators. The program was developed by and meets the Wisconsin Association of Mediator recommended Mediator Training Curriculum. A certificate of completion will be provided to those who complete the classroom training. Topics include:

- Theories of conflict and conflict management
- Overview of the mediation process and a mediation demonstration
- Understanding of individual responses to conflict
- Mediation step by step
- Ethical practice of mediation
- Coached role-plays
